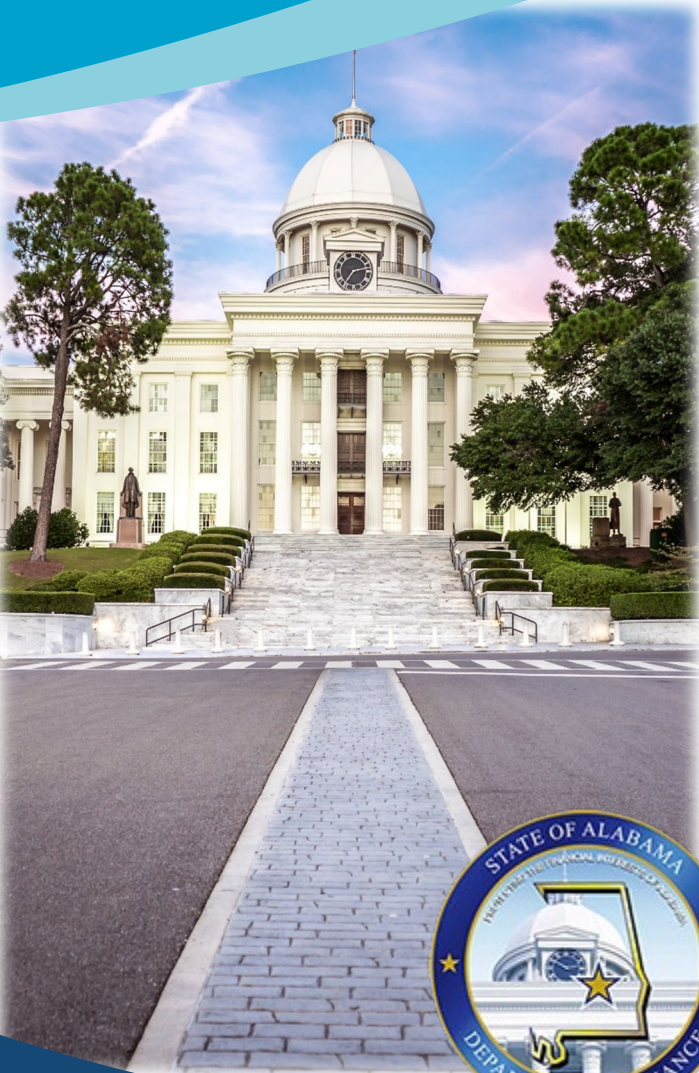


# Budget Analyst



## What will you do?

The Budget Analyst is a unique position in state government that combines public policy with public finance. Budget Analysts maintain a portfolio of state agencies, boards, commissions, and universities. They compile and analyze budget requests and operation plans as well as monitor the day-to-day finances of these assigned entities in order to become subject matter experts. They work together with other state agencies such as the Department of Revenue, the State Treasury, and the State Comptroller's Office, perform research on public policy, and produce oral and written presentations. Since the work they do is so specific, there are ample opportunities for steady career advancement through in-house promotions. There is no other position like this in state government!

## Who are we?

The Executive Budget Office (EBO) is a division of the Department of Finance and currently has 13 employees. The EBO is legally responsible for preparing the information concerning the State's budgets and its execution, revenue estimates, review of appropriation acts, and fiscal analysis. The EBO also assists the Director of Finance and the Governor in duties relating to the formulation of the budget, correlating, and revising the estimates of revenues and requests for appropriations of all budgeted agencies, and investigating, supervising, and coordinating the expenditures and other fiscal operations of such agencies.
